BULK TRASH DATES SET FOR JANUARY 2019

Due to increasing demand, bulk trash pickup will be split again into two separate weeks each period. Those trash customers north of SH-37 will be picked up the first week, and those living south of SH-37 will be picked up the second week.

- Monday, January 7th is Bulk Trash Week for trash customers north of SH-37.
- Monday, January 14th is Bulk Trash Week for trash customers south of SH-37.

All items for bulk trash pickup should be placed at the curb no later than 6:00 am Monday the week of pick-up. **Please allow Republic Services the entire week to pick up your bulk trash.**

1/14	Bulk Trash Week for those south of SH-37
1/21-1/25	Recycling Week

During New Year's week trash service will be delayed for one day for all trash customers whose trash day is normally on Tuesday, (Purple Zone), Wednesday (Red Zone), Thursday (Blue Zone) or Friday (Yellow Zone).

- No schedule changes for those who normally have their trash picked up on Mondays.
- Those who normally have their trash picked up on Tuesday will have their trash picked up on Wednesday, January 2nd.
- Those who normally have their trash picked up on Wednesday will have their trash picked up on Thursday, January 3rd.
- Those who normally have their trash picked up on Thursday will have their trash picked up on Friday, January 4th.
- Those who normally have their trash picked up on Friday will have their trash picked up on Saturday, January 5th.

Please have your trash polycarts at the curb ready for pick-up no later than 6:00 am on your designated trash day.

COLD WEATHER SAFETY TIPS FOR FIRE PREVENTION.

Well everyone here comes the cold! As we fire up our heaters please remember these few things. Everyone needs to have at least one smoke detector in their home. If possible there should be a smoke detector on each level of your home, preferably just outside the sleeping areas. Smoke detectors should be installed on the ceiling or high on the wall, but never place them in the corner of the wall/ceiling joint as this becomes a dead air space during a fire and smoke may be delayed reaching the detector. We can not stress how important smoke detectors are. They give your family critical notice of a fire and will alert you within seconds of detecting the smoke allowing you and your family to escape.

Equally important is a carbon monoxide detector. A malfunctioning gas stove or heater can produce and cause a dangerous build up of carbon monoxide. A CO detector should be installed about four (4) to five (5) feet from the floor on the wall as CO gas is barely lighter than air and is almost neutral in its movement (regarding rising or sinking in air).

Space heaters should be a minimum of three (3) feet from any flammable objects and on a good level surface. Make sure they can not easily be knocked over by pets or children. Space heaters should never be plugged into power strips or extension cords (especially

those small cheap lamp cords, they are not designed to handle the amount of energy that a space heater requires and will likely overheat and catch fire. Plug space heaters directly into the wall outlet. Space heaters should never be left running when you are away from home or when you are sleeping. Beware of overloaded breakers in your breaker panel. If a breaker trips frequently it should be checked by an electrician and replaced. When a breaker trips, it is warning you of a potential problem. Seek out and correct the overload problem.

Wood burning stoves and fireplaces deserve the same respect of maintaining a safe area for keeping flammables away. Wood can pop and crack sending burning embers flying out. Make sure anything flammable is kept away from the chimney and/or stove pipe. These pipes can get extremely hot and ignite any flammables that come in contact with them.

It is very important to go over with your family (children especially) what to do in case of a fire. They need to know, that no matter what, they have to GET OUT OF THE HOUSE AND NEVER HIDE!! Make sure the entire family knows the meeting place once they have made it outside. Practice EDITH...Escape Drills In The Home....it's for your family's safety. I can't think of anything more important.

TRASH & RECYCLING TEXT REMINDERS

The text-reminder system has been set up to provide a reminder notice the evening prior to your trash and recycling day. Everyone must enroll in the text-reminder system based on the color zone on the trash route map on our website and the Tuttle App. The Tuttle App will not be used for weekly trash service reminders. To enroll for text-reminders, text one of the color zones, based on where you live, to 95577:

- Text GREENZONE if you live in the green zone,
- Text PURPLEZONE if you live in the purple zone,
- Text REDZONE if you live in the red zone,
- Text BLUEZONE if you live in the blue zone, or
- Text YELLOWZONE if you live in the yellow zone.

CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Public Works construction activities anticipated in month of January:

- Contractors are constructing fiber service in neighborhoods fronting SH-37, moving to the east. Work has also begun for all areas not served by Pioneer Telephone's fiber located east of Mustang Rd. This project is 100% paid for by fiber service customers.
- Contractors are constructing the trail extension at the Tuttle Soccer Complex. Work will begin later this Spring for a new restroom facility and lighting improvements. This project is 80% paid for by grants and 20% from the Capital Improvement Fee.
- Contractors are making repairs to the Jason White Water Tower. Based on the currently approved work and known information, the project is funded 100% by warranty. Work is expected to be completed by February 2019.
